When may the photographer take pictures?

Photographers can begin taking photographs 60 minutes prior to the wedding ceremony. Because indoor photography must be finished by 7:30, 1:00 or 4:00 p.m., you will want to take those pictures first. You are welcome to continue taking outdoor photographs after the indoor timeframe expires.

Who else may take pictures?

To maintain a sacred atmosphere during your wedding, and because you are hiring a professional photographer to capture your wedding ceremony, the use of cameras by the wedding party or your guests is not permitted once you and your future spouse have reached the altar.

May children be part of our wedding?

Flower girls and ring bearers are permitted. Very young children may need to be accompanied into church by an adult. Please consult with your wedding coordinator if you are planning for children to be part of your ceremony.

How do we select music for our wedding?

Your wedding coordinator can provide you with extensive suggestions and samples of appropriate liturgical music.

When may our florist decorate the church or chapel?

Florists may begin decorating in the worship space 60 minutes before the wedding. Your wedding coordinator will provide you with guidelines to give to your florist. As a safety precaution, aisle runners are not allowed.

She will lead the rehearsal, and on the day of your wedding, she will be at the church to coordinate your day so that you and your future spouse are free to focus on what you are doing: giving yourselves to each other and God in the sacrament of marriage.

We are very happy that you have chosen to prepare for your marriage and to celebrate your wedding day at Holy Spirit Parish. May God continue to bless and increase your love and devotion to each other.

When will the rehearsal be and how long will it last?

Rehearsals are held at 5:30 p.m. on the day prior to the wedding in the same location as the wedding (chapel weddings rehearse in the chapel; church weddings rehearse in the church).

If two weddings are scheduled on the same Saturday, the morning wedding rehearsal will be at 5:30 p.m. and the afternoon wedding rehearsal will be at 6:30 p.m.

All rehearsals last no longer than 60 minutes.

What about attire?

Since the wedding liturgy is a sacred and prayerful event, please select attire for yourself and your entire bridal party that is respectful for worship in the house of God. Skirt length should be suitable for a religious event.
